

PREFACE OF THE FIRST EDITION

In the preface of the first edition of the Pearl of Great Price Elder Fraklin D. Richards states:

The following compilation has been induced by the repeated solicitation of several friends of the publisher, who are desirous to be put in possession of the very important articles contained therein. Most of the Revelations composing this work were published at early periods of the Church, when the circulation of its journals was so very limited as to render them comparatively unknown at present, except to a few who have treasured up the products of the Church with great care from the beginning. A smaller portion of this work has never before appeared in print; and altogether it is presumed, that true believers in the Divine mission of the Prophet Joseph Smith, will appreciate this little collection of precious truths as a *Pearl of Great Price* that will increase their ability to maintain and to defend the holy faith by becoming possessors of it.

Although not adapted, nor designed, as a pioneer of faith among unbelievers, still it will commend itself to all careful students of the scriptures, and detailing many important facts which are therein only alluded to, or entirely unmentioned, but consonant with the whole tenor of the revealed will of God; and, to the beginner in the gospel, will add confirmatory evidence of the rectitude of his faith, by showing him that the doctrines and ordinances thereof are the same as were revealed to Adam for his salvation after his expulsion from the garden, and the same that he handed down and caused to be taught to his generations after him, as the only means appointed of God by which the generations of men may regain his presence.

Nor do we conceive it possible for any unprejudiced person to arise from a careful perusal of this work, without being deeply impressed with a sense of the Divine calling, and holy ordination, of the man by whom these revelations, translations, and narrations have been communicated to us. As impervious as the minds of men may be at present to these convictions, the day is not far distant when sinners, as well as Saints, will know Joseph Smith was one of the greatest men that ever lived upon the earth, and that under God he was the Prophet and founder of the dispensation of the fulness of times, in which will be gathered together into one all things which are in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth.

PEARL OF GREAT PRICE ACCEPTED BY PRESIDENT YOUNG

As early as 1857, at least one copy of the first edition of the *Pearl of Great Price* had found its way to Salt Lake City and was placed by the President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints among the important doctrinal works of the Church. A statement appears in the *Latter-day Saint Journal History* on August 13 of that year to the effect that "President Brigham Young, president, seer, and revelator of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints" had that day deposited in the temple at Salt Lake City a number of church books, pamphlets, and newspapers. A list was made of those publications and the *Pearl of Great Price* was included in that list.

Make-up and Contents of the First Edition, 1851

A number of suggestions have been given in this book up to this point in regard to the contents of the *Pearl of Great Price*, but it now becomes advisable to make a definite study of the make-up and contents of the various editions that have been published.

The first edition of the Pearl of Great Price (published in 1851 in England) was not divided into verses, as is the book at the present time, nor was it divided into double columns. Also, it was a little larger than it is today, because it contained some of the material which is in the Doctrine and Covenants. To avoid duplications in our scriptures, that material was later deleted. The Doctrine and Covenants' material which appeared in the first edition of the Pearl of Great Price was the seventy-seventh section which was entitled at that time "A Key to the Revelation of St. John, written by Joseph Smith;" and also, "A Revelation and Prophecy by the Prophet Joseph Smith given on War, December 25, 1832." In addition to these, it contained from the Doctrine and Covenants extracts from the commandments to the Church concerning baptism, the duties of members after they were baptized, methods of administering the sacrament of the Lord's supper, the duties of elders, priests, teachers, and deacons, a revelation on Priesthood, the calling and duties of the Twelve Apostles, the calling and duties of the Seventy, and extracts from the revelation which told of the rise of the Church of Jesus Christ.3 In addition to the foregoing, the last page of the book contained the words to the song "O, Say What is Truth?" which were written by John Jaques.

FIRST AMERICAN EDITION, 1878

The first American edition of the *Pearl of Great Price* was published in Salt Lake City in 1878. It agreed in practically every detail with the first edition which was published by Franklin D. Richards in England in 1851. However, it contained the addition of "The Revelation on the Eternity of the Marriage Covenant, including Plurality of Wives, given through Joseph Smith, the Seer, in Nauvoo, Hancock County, Illinois, July 12, 1843." This revelation today is found as section 132 of the *Doctrine and Covenants*.

1902 Edition

In 1902 an edition of the *Pearl of Great Price* was printed which omitted the material duplicating the *Doctrine and Covenants'* revelations. That edition, in contents, was exactly

like the Pearl of Great Price as we have it today. The 1902 edition was the first one to appear in print divided into chapters and verses with references; however, its pages were not divided into double columns. The study helps were prepared by Dr. James E. Talmage under the direction of President Joseph F. Smith. That edition was used for the following nineteen years without further changes being made.

1921 Edition

In 1921 more changes were made in the make-up of the Pearl of Great Price. This edition was the first one to be published in double-column pages with a comprehensive index. Elder James E. Talmage was primarily responsible for making this arrangement of the text and the index. The purpose of dividing the pages into double columns was to shorten the lines and thereby make reading of the scripture easier and more attractive. Also, the book followed the printing pattern used in the Bible and the other standard works of the Church. No further changes have been made in the make-up of the Pearl of Great Price since 1921; therefore, that edition is the one that the Church uses today.

It would be well to take a copy of the Pearl of Great Price published in 1921 or since that date and observe carefully the way in which it is composed. It is interesting to collect all of the editions that have been discussed and compare their make-

up and contents with each other.

Editions in Foreign Languages

The *Pearl of Great Price* has also been translated and published in the following foreign languages: Welsh (1852, Wales); German (1882, Bern, Switzerland); Danish (1883, Salt Lake City); Dutch (1911, Rotterdam, Holland); Hawaiian (1914, Honolulu, Hawaii); Maori (1919, Auckland, New Zealand); Samoan (1944, Salt Lake City); Spanish (1948, Salt Lake City).

CONTENTS OF THE PEARL OF GREAT PRICE

The table of contents indicates that our present edition of the *Pearl of Great Price* is composed of four principal items:

X Essay: Describe Apocalyptic Theme in Five Dispensations.

Apocalyptic literature has ten major characteristics.

- (1) Dualism, the good and evil, the light and darkness and the bliss and woe.
- (2) Two Worlds, the spiritual and physical, and life on earth and life before and after death.
- (3) The Dispensation, apocalyptic literature is given in reguard to a particular time, or prophet of a given dispensation.
- (4) The Messiahs coming is prophesied.
- (5) Historical Realities, the prophet writing or speaking has a time and place in history.
- (6) The Millennium, the millennial reign of peace is prophesied, a time when"the earth shall rest from her labors".
- (7) Moral Teachings, revelations concerning mans relationship with his God and fellow man.
- (8) Attitude toward the "Sacred", the Temple and its ordanances, instructions to the "elect".
- (9) Nature of Man, where did he come from? Why is man here on earth? Where is he going after death.
- (10) Upheavels of Nature, the judgements of God upon man.

Each Dispensation has "apocalyptic themes" that it common among all dispensations. The themes being: (1) the situation, or social iniquity. (2) The "heros" reaction to the situation. (3) The Lords reply to the "heros" reaction in the form of a revelation.

(4) The visions from the Lord, these visions usually in the form of a theophony, and cosmology. (5) The "hero" returns from the

vision to give a "testament and will" to his posterity and mankind.

The "heros" mission, the preaching of the word of God. (7) The death of the "hero".

In discussing the five dispensations scriptures will be used in reference to these seven themes of the apocalyptic. Each dispensation will be comparied in paralles columns under each theme.

One theme not discussed here or in class is that of the calling of the "Hero" or propher. Each dispensation begins with this calling, which should be placed between the 'situation' and 'reaction'.

1. To seal the testimony of this book and the Book of Mormon, we announce the martyrdom of Joseph Smith the Prophet, and Hyrum Smith the Patriarch. They were shot in Carthage jail, on the 27th of June, 1844, about five o'clock p.m., by an armed mob-painted black-of from 150 to 200 persons. Hyrum was shot first and fell calmly, exclaiming: I am a dead man! Joseph leaped from the window, and was shot dead in the attempt, exclaiming: O Lord my God! They were both shot after they were dead, in a brutal manner, and both received four balls.

4. When Joseph went to Carthage to deliver himself up to the pretended requirements of the law, two or three days previous to his assassination, he said: "I am going like a lamb to the slaughter; but I am calm as a summer's morning; I have a conscience void of offense towards God, and towards all men. I SHALL DIE INNOCENT, AND IT SHALL YET BE SAID OF ME-HE WAS MURDERED IN COLD BLOOD." —The same morning, after Hyrum had made ready to go—shall it be said to the slaughter? yes, for so it was-he read the following paragraph, near the close of the twelfth chapter of Ether, in the Book of Mormon, and turned down the leaf upon it:

first P.of G.P. published on Jully 11,1851 at 15 Wilton street, Licwepool, England.

The English edition was so popular that John Taylor ask orson



pratt to prepare an American edition some things were deleted and some added.

Sundy October 10 1880 in general conference the P. of G.P. was canonized.

1890 The Articles of Faith were cononized in Oct. Conference

1902 James Talmage had compledted the ch. and verses underthe direcxtion of the 1st Pres. sustained in oct Conf.

1921 PGP was turned to double column and an index was added by Talmage.

1976 two revelations were added JS vision of the CK and Joseph F. Smith vision of the redemption of the dead.



1979 the two new additions were moved to the D&c

1981 a preface was added and the titles of three of the four books in the bood were changed. The book of Moses became "Selcetions from the Book of Mosew. Wriotings of Joseph Smith 1 was named J.S. Mathew and JS 2 was renamed JS Histrory the 1981 edition used photoprints of the facsimiles as they appeared in the Times and Seasopns in 1842 when Joseph first published them.
